FOR PARENTS – INTRO

Dear Parents,

I have been in ministry in various positions for 14 years. I am sorry it has taken me this long to realize the need for this booklet!

It is also amazing to me that so little accurate, child-friendly material on salvation exists. This booklet tries to solve this problem.

I encourage you to go through this book with your child. It is designed to be done in short sections, building one chapter on the next. Each section should take 20 minutes at most. When you complete all the lessons, there is an, optional final “quiz” for your child that will help you in determining if your child is ready to be baptized.

Keep in mind that all the subjects are presented in simplified, child-friendly language. Doctrines like the Triune nature of God are affirmed but naturally not discussed in detail.

Some children really are ready young (or very young by some standards); others are better waiting. The most important thing is, “Do they understand what they are doing?” It is this book’s desire to help you know if your child is ready. However, only you really know.

I do want to encourage you that no one is perfectly “ready” or “worthy” to be baptized; it is not a matter of merit, but understanding. Once you are convinced your child understands salvation and goes through the steps before baptism, they are ready to be baptized.

Learning our Bible means we read and learn a small part of it daily. Praying means we ask God for what we need.

To learn your Bible, ask your mom or dad to help you find a Bible story to read every day. There are over 200! Most are short and easy to understand. Start with those. A good example is John 9:1-11 where Jesus makes a blind man see! You can keep reading if you want to know more what happened to the man.

To pray, bow your head, fold your hands, and close your eyes. You don't have to do these things, but they help anyone focus. Then begin your prayer with "Father" or "Heavenly Father". You are talking to God the Father, and He is listening to you! Ask Him for what you need. Then thank Him for what He has done for you (you can thank Him for anything!). Then close with, "In Jesus' name I pray, Amen." We pray to God the Father, through Jesus, His Son.
